Hidden Objects: Suitable for 1 child or more.

Equipment:

- A sheet or blanket.
- A selection of random everyday objects.

What to do:

Ask the children to select a book.

Ask the children to collect 5 small random objects from around the house that are related to the book.

Place these items on a tray/table.

Ask the children to explain the reason for the object they have chosen and how it relates to the book or story.

(For example, for 'Going On A Bear Hunt', the objects are those we might see in the story that the family use on their journey: woolly jumper, water bottle, stick, flowers, pair of shoes, leaves, stones, scarf, gloves,

torch, umbrella, hat, teddy bear, backpack, door key etc.)

Cover the objects with a tea towel or small blanket.

The children are given 30 seconds to look at the objects underneath the sheet. They need to try and memorise what there is. While the children shut their eyes remove one object and hide it out of sight. The children try and guess what has been removed. Repeat.

Using the object from under the blanket ask the children to write a short story.
