





Bills to Pay

Overview: An engaging way to help bills make sense and show the cost of running a home.

Time: 10 minutes

Equipment required: Dry wipe board or large piece of paper and pen .

Benefits:

- Helps children appreciate the cost of running a household and how they can help.
- Great way to build maths skills.
- Improves understanding of the value of money.

Part One:

- 1. List on class whiteboard or paper five things we need to paybills for. Examples include gas, electricity, water, broadband, window cleaning, school dinners etc.
- 2. Ask the children to estimate how much per month their house pays for each one.
- 3. Discuss: Which ones are seen as the least and most expensive? Why?
- 4. Discuss: Which is the most important to a happy life? Why?

Part Two:

- 1. Provide an average monthly cost for each of the types of bills listed.
- 2. Ask the children to figure out the total cost of the average bill.
- 3. Discuss: are they surprised at how much it costs? Why?
- 4. Discuss: what can be done to reduce household bills?
