





House to Home

Sponsored by Game of Actual Life



Overview: A communication activity that works best in groups but can be adapted for one child.

Time: 5 - 15 minutes

Equipment required: Paper and pencils.

Benefits:

- Helps children appreciate the home they live in.
- Helps show that whilst each house may be individual, they can be similar, too.
- Encourages positive and open discussion.

"My home is"

- 1. Have all the children sat around in a circle, or sit opposite your child.
- 2. Play a game of 'finish the sentence with the following prompts:
- 2. "My house can be described as...
- 3. "My favourite part of my house is... Because..."
- 4. "A semi-detatched house is..."

"My first house"

- 1. Invite the children to think about what they'd like the first house they'll own to look like.
- 2. On a piece of paper, ask them to copy and complete the sentence "When I buy or rent my first house, I want it to be....

 Because..."
- 3. Finally, everybody can draw a picture of their ideal first home. Invite them to share this and explain why they've drawn it that way.
