





Transport Troubles

Sponsored by Game of Actual Life



Overview: A whole-class activity which helps children talk about different forms of transport.

Time: 10 minutes

Equipment required: A whiteboard and pens or a large piece of paper and pens.

Benefits:

- Helps children understand forms of transport.
- Encourages thought about alternative forms of transport.
- Promotes thought about environmentally friendly ways of travelling.

Part One:

- 1. Ask the children to name five different ways to get from one place to another (car, train, plane, bike, scooter, walking)
- 2. Write them down on the left side of the board.
- 3. Ask children to name five reasons to travel (holiday, work, shopping, school, hobbies etc.).
- 4. Write these down on the right side of the board.

Part Two:

- 1. Invite the children to match one form of transport to one of the reasons to travel.
- 2. Ask children to explain what makes this method appropriate.
- 3. Ask them whether each type is needed e.g. "do we HAVE to use a plane to go on holiday?".
- 4. Ask them to come up with an alternative form of transport for each reason.
