





What's My Job?

Overview: A quick-fire guessing game for groups of three or more.

Time: 5-10 minutes

Equipment required: A dry wipe board or pieces of paper and pens.

Benefits:

- Improves children's understanding of various types of jobs available.
- Helps children think outside the box when considering future careers.
- Leads to an improved appreciation of a wide range of jobs.

Setting Up The Game:

- 1. Have a range of jobs written on separate cards, big enough for the class to read.
- 2. Call for a volunteer to stand, facing the other players
- 3. Hold one of the job cards behind their head, so they can't see.
- 4. The child will try to guess their job based on the three clues given by the other players.
- 5. Once they guess correctly, swap over and use a different job for the next child to guess.

The Clues:

- 1. Ask the others to identify three key skills needed to do this job well.
- 2. Ask them how much they think somebody with this job gets paid a year.
- 3. Finally, ask a them to explain why this job is beneficial. They can start with the sentence "This job is important to society because..."
